TRAVEL SMART WITH YOUR SUIT

A man about town needs to be prepared to impress when he travels. Whether it's a business trip or a holiday, the lines are continuously blurred about what you need to take along.

Business travel always calls for a minimalistic, smart approach towards packing. It needs to be well planned to ensure that you have all the clothes you need for the meetings that you have at your destination. While travelling for a holiday affords more flexibility, it can be cumbersome because you probably need to account for more than one occasion.

Some of these tips from Mahir Ali, Head of Operations & Design at Ascots & Chapels, can help you travel smart with your dapper suit...

Always empty out the pockets before you pack your suit. The contents of your pockets can increase the chances of creasing, or in some instances break or, worse, cause the pockets to tear. A broken pen, ink and sharp edges equals permanent damage. One of the oldest tricks in the book is to fold your suit jacket inside out. This prevents wrinkling and any damage to the face of the fabric.

Trousers should be folded in half length-wise, and then into half again. This is to preserve the crease. Trousers are more prone to

creasing because their structure is not supported by the garment construction found in a jacket.

Hang the suit immediately upon reaching your destination, so it retains

its form and prevents further wrinkling. This helps to air the suit, and ensures that you don't smell like your luggage at your meeting.

If you feel it needs slight pressing, then some light steam on the wrinkled areas can do the trick and restore the sharpness to your suit.

Try to carry an extra trouser to match your iacket. Trousers absorb more moisture due to direct contact with the body, whereas jackets are separated by at least one layer of clothing, making them easier to maintain. Also, suit jackets tend to be worn for half the time the corresponding trousers are.

Use a lint remover. It could prove to be the best use of three minutes. Garments tend to gather lint when they are packed, and a lint remover is easy to carry and can keep your suit looking crisp.

A travel bag for your suit is a neat investment. It cuts your problems associated with maintaining a suit in half. It is particularly handy if you need to hang your suit in a hotel room that has the typical "mildewy" odour of a hotel carpet.
