Rhaoni Silva, aka 'Mywaydrobe' as his Instagram followers know him by, says that the essentials for a modern man begins with three very important steps. "Fit, versatility and weight is my mantra," says Rhaoni. "Fit is super key because you need to figure out what your correct size is. A majority of men wear clothes two sizes too big!" If you've seen Crazy Stupid Love, you'll remember that that's exactly what Ryan Gosling's character tells the hapless Cal Weaver (Steve Carell) about his suits. "Versatility is about having a few 'key pieces' of clothes that you can mix and match for various occasions," continues Rhaoni, "and the weight of the fabric is particularly important here, especially since we're constantly going from hot to cold."

"Men are often guilty of being 'difficult to shop for' or having 'a limited

#### FOOTWEAR

 Nice leather sandals (make sure your pedicure is perfect for that)

Low top sneaker, such as white Converse

- · Running/fitness comfy shoes
- Lace up in black and brown
- Monkstrap in leather or suede

#### **►** SUITS

- 1 black suit
- 1 navy suit
- 1 grey suit
- Perhaps 1 tuxedo blazer on the same finish as the black suit, for versatility in case of a more refined cocktail event.

#### ACCESSORIES

- Many ties / pocket square variations
- Belts (formal matching the shoes and casual in either fabric or rope)
- Leather laptop bag
- A male clutch for the more up-to-date
- A good and well branded travel wallet (passport, cards, money from different countries)
- An expensive-looking card holder for nights out (it will impress those around you.)

repertoire' of tastes," explains Mahir Ali, artistic director and head of operations at Ascots & Chapels. "We are often better offinvesting in classics that are timeless, and accessorising to make our look upto-date or current." Mahir suggests having some staples in the closet as a great canvas on which a man can have a splash of flamboyance in the form of accessories. "Investing in a sensible artillery would mean that these comprise almost 60 per cent of the wardrobe's volume, but less than 20 per cent of the cost," adds Mahir. "Two pairs of classic denims - light and dark blue - a sports jacket, a well-fitted pair of chinos or khakis, a handful of polo Ts and a few pairs of casual shorts are a must."

Shoes are another important part of the wardrobe and can complement and lift an ensemble to a different level. "I usually recommend three different kinds

- Get your suits from the masters brands like Ralph Lauren, Brioni, Gucci, Dior Homme, Cornelliani, Salvatore Ferragamo etc, that give you bespoke options ensuring a perfect fit.
- Make sure you pick the right fabrics, with good textures and weight, particularly for the local weather.
- If on a budget, there are a variety of tailors in Dubai, like in Satwa, that offer a good selection of fabrics. Take a photo of your favourite type of suit so the tailors can reproduce the look.
- Don't forget that you can mix and match — the separates are all the rage — if you have a nice jacket that can double up as formal and casual night out wear.



of shoes - sleek black shoes for formal events, rubber shoes for laidback comfy times and brown leather/moccasin/ suede to go in between gatherings (formal to semi-formal to casual)," adds Ushi Sato, author of The Shades and Scarf blog, who also does a fair bit of personal shopping for the more undiscerning. "One can't exaggerate the benefit of a nice pair of leather sandals," says Rhaoni, provided you have the pedicured feet for it! He also recommends having a pair of sneakers handy, especially if you can get some Nikes or Converses. Fashionable trainers are in! Mahir suggests a 'top five' - a good oxford black, a classic tan wingtip brogue, a moccasin, a pair of trainers and a pair of trusty sandals. "Of course, some interesting socks to complement them all!"

With sneakers in mind, the other casual thing you need in your closet is a pair of jeans, or three, as Ushi recommends, or four as per Rhaoni's suggestion. "Get four pairs of well-fitted jeans in blue, dark blue, black and white. They go a long way and can easily be swapped for a smart casual look," says Rhaoni. "A black, blue and washed or stone-washed jeans is all you need, and will save you from a 'what to wear' moment like no other!" adds Ushi. "Also, never underestimate the power of a plain white T-shirt. It's very sexy and can easily be paired with a jacket for a great look."

Now that you've got those down, it's time to take stock of your accessories.

"Stop hoarding watches!" advises Ushi. "You really only need two watches one that is more casual and can be worn daily (preferably water resistant), and one with a nice leather strap for more formal functions. Good quality watches are key."

match your shoes or at least complement them - "Leather ones for formal and rope or fabric ones for more casual occasions," says Rhaoni. "It also helps to have an expensive card holder, to impress those you meet on a night out," he adds. "Cufflinks have always been amongst the most acceptable pieces of jewellery that men can invest in. From subtle sterling silver and mother-of-pearl options to statement gemstone pieces to offset candy-toned shirts - you can never go too loud with these," adds Mahir. "Subtlety is key!" he says, to achieve an understated classy look. "Pocket squares have made a comeback in a big way, and wearing them in different ways can lend personality to your suit everyday. Some colourful silk pocket squares balanced by more subtle whites are a great investment," he adds.

Some of the trending accessories from the runways seem to be classy document holders, wide-brimmed hats and mirrored sunglasses. The document holders are a chic alternative to the classic briefcase or urban messenger bag. Fedoras, wide brim Panamas and even bowler hats are making a big splash courtesy of fans of the Pharrell Williams look.
